## **NOTICE TO RECREATIONAL BOATERS**

### **U.S Army Corps of Engineers Channel Maintenance Dredging** **Beginning in the Inner Turning Basin adjacent to the Port's Wharf 5 and** **Ending at the Channel Entrance to S.F. Bay**

- Dredging operations are expected to begin August 1, 2019 and will be completed in mid-October 2019
- Dredging will occur 24/7 until project completion
- There will be two (2) dredges working on the project:
  - 1) One dredge will begin at the Inner Turning Basin and work outward to the Bay
  - 2) The second dredge will begin near Markers 11/12 and work outward to the Bay

### **WATCH OUT FOR THE FOLLOWING EQUIPMENT AND VESSELS**

- Dredge Barges and Dump Scows
- Survey and Crew Boats

### **FOR YOUR SAFETY**

- Use VHF radio channels 13, 14, and 80 to alert dredge of recreational boater's intentions.
- Stay vigilant and attach lights for dredge, tugs, crew and survey boats to see recreational boaters during nighttime hours.
- Dredge will use anchor buoys. Stay closer to the anchor buoy and away from the dredge.
- Stay a safe distance of at least 100 feet from dredge or scows.
- Please be advised that when a tug is pushing the dredge or scows, they stop very slowly. Do not overtake the dredge or scows too closely when they are moving.
- Know the rights of passage and law of tonnage. Use common sense.
- Avoid the middle of the channel used by contractor equipment and use outside edges of channel.
- PLEASE NOTE THAT PORT CARGO OPERATIONS WILL STILL BE OCCURING.
